
ENCOUNTER, DETAINMENT, OR ARREST?

The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no Warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized.



Law Enforcement contacts:



» Encounter

» Detainment

» Arrest



Officers with probable cause will arrest you!

- They do <u>NOT</u> need to have an encounter with you.
- They do <u>NOT</u> need to detain you.
- The <u>ONLY</u> reason for an encounter or detainment is to <u>OBTAIN</u> probable cause for arrest.
- The only <u>LEGAL</u> way for them to get the info they need to arrest you, is with consent from <u>YOU</u>





The Officer may:

- Ask to talk.
- Ask for ID.
- Ask for explanation.
- There is NO requirement that you do <u>ANY</u> of these things. Ask, "*Am I being Detained?*"
- If the answer is <u>NO</u> say, "*Thank you*," and leave.



ENCOUNTER:



What an officer may not do.

" He may not STOP you.

" He may not make demands.

" He may not use force.





The Officer <u>NEEDS</u> reasonable suspicion to detain a suspect. The <u>officer must suspect that</u>:

- A crime had just been committed,
- A crime was being committed,
- A crime was about to be committed,

AND

The person being detained committed the crime.

SIGNS OF DETAINMENT:



- Red and blue lights behind you.
- You are commanded to do, or to not do something, (i.e. produce a license) or as simple as "Put out that cigarette."
- Frisk / Pat down search.
- Handcuffs.
- When asked, Officer says you are being detained.

HANDLING DETAINMENT:



- ASK: "Am I being detained?"
- If answered yes,
- ASK: "What crime am I suspected of committing?"
- If answered with straight answer, such as Burglary, failure to stop, theft, etc...
- DO NOT CONSENT, EXCERCISE 5th AMEND.
- If LEO eludes that he is just investigating, ask: "Investigating what crime?"
- "Am I being detained?" Or: "Am I free to go?"





Any thing you say, can and will be held against you! Exceptions are: "I DO NOT CONSENT!!"

You can, however, ask questions.

- "Am I being detained?"
- "Am I free to go?"
- "What crime am I suspected of committing?"





I have a license to drive it, and you need a warrant to search it!

- Do not consent!
- <u>Verbally</u> resist any attempts to search your vehicle or person. (If patted down, say "I do not consent")
- Do not remove clothing or equipment. Ask for a warrant that specifies what they are looking for and where they will find it. Ask to have your attorney present.

"Tell me where you're going."
